# **Alternate Dog Park**

(formerly known as Small Dog Park)

#### Be Nice - Be Fair - Share

Mostly the **Alternate Dog Park** will be used as it always has ... shy dogs, older dogs, dogs recovering from surgery or needing special assistance, etc.

We will use the **Alternate Dog Park** occasionally for special activities – and will post on Yahoo Group and on the gate and message board to provide plenty of notice before each event.

You may enjoy the space on a solo basis, as long as no other member wishes to use it. Always discuss the needs of others, and work out a fair arrangement. If it is determined that one of the dogs will not be suited to share the space – then that is the dog who must leave, immediately. But, special needs dogs should get preference over a rambunctious dog needing a time out.

4-Leggeds who have been in a scuffle (*a fight, not a wrestling match*) have lost their dog park privileges for the day.

All parties in the scuffle must **Go Home Immediately!** 

## **Keep the GATE CLOSED**

The **Alternate Dog Park** is not a cut-thru, and those who need the space have asked to keep the gate closed. Otherwise, as they come in, lots of other dogs are freely running in and out – which essentially renders the space temporarily useless for the special needs group. Please respect this – and ask others to as well.

# Why do some dogs eat poop?

Although it is somewhat unpleasant to talk about, many pet owners have experienced coprophagia (the medical term for "eating feces") with their dogs. Not only do dogs eat their own stool, but they often like the feces of cats, birds, deer, rabbits and others! This behavior is most common in puppies up to a year old, but can occur at any stage throughout a dog's life.

Coprophagia is usually harmless, but *can* sometimes spread an infectious disease or parasite to your dog. It can also cause gastroenteritis that results in vomiting or diarrhea.

There are many theories about why dogs engage in this behavior, but most fall into two categories – **behavioral** or **medical**.

Sometimes a dog begins to eat feces if they have an underlying health problem such as diabetes, parasitic infections and/or gastrointestinal disease. However, other signs like vomiting, diarrhea, excessive thirst, Lethargy and weight loss would usually be present along with the coprophagia.

When analyzing the behavioral cause of dog coprophagia, it is helpful to remember that dogs are VERY different from humans! A human does not (usually!) enjoy the smell or taste of a rotting animal carcass, spoiled food, putrid water, urine, or feces. Unfortunately, these are often favorites of our canine friends! Some dog breeds seem to practice coprophagia more than others. My two Portuguese Water Dogs love to search for "snacks" in the yard or litter pan, but my other dogs have shown little interest!



# Possible reasons some dogs eat feces

- They simply like the taste, especially when there is undigested food present. Poor digestion can happen when a dog is overfed, or eats people food. Dogs seem to especially enjoy the taste of cat feces, perhaps because of the flavor of high-protein cat food.
- They are bored and looking for something to do.
- They are stressed and experiencing anxiety of some kind.
- The yard is filled with feces, and they are trying to "pick-up" and "clean-up" their environment.
- They have been punished for eliminating in the wrong place and are attempting to "hide" the evidence.



- They are trying to get attention from their owner
- They have learned coprophagia from other dogs and it has become a habit

# Helpful tips to stop your dog from eating feces

High **quality dog food** – at regular intervals

Coprophagia Deterrent food additive – designed to make feces taste bad. (Over the counter brands: Deter, Potty Mouth, Nasty Habit – Always check with your vet before using!)

Add **pineappl**e or **pumpkin** to your dog's food. Dogs don't mind the taste but it may make their feces unappealing.

Teach your dog the "**Leave It**!" command and try to catch them in the act.

Plenty of **exercise** and **mental stimulation** – try walking your dog on-leash until he has a bowel movement

Keep your dog's living area and yard clean. **Pick up the poop!** 

Caution: Some people say that putting hot sauce or cayenne pepper on feces will deter a dog, but I do not recommend trying it.

# Goal: \$5,000

Current Cash: \$3,000

Our target goal is between \$4,000 - \$5,000. For safety reasons, we prefer to hire a contractor to do the heavy equipment operation to dig a deep freeze-proof trench and lay the pipe. They need to dig under the fence, and around electric lines and sprinkler lines. We could save money by using our members to do the back fill – which is moving the dirt back into the trench by hand and doing all the final above ground work, like fencing, gravel/cement pad, washing table, etc. We will get bids in July and fine tune a cost and an installation time table so that the project may be completed this summer, or as soon as we have the funds.

<u>Please consider donating what you feel the amenity is worth to you</u>. We would like to have our dog wash area in place before we lose our warm weather turf. **Every \$10-25 helps**, so just give what you can.

Call our general Message Center Phone and hit our hotline #2 To protect our turf and keep the green stuff growing as long as possible, SWCDP management will close the dog park after prolonged or heavy rains or melting of large amounts of ice or snow. We will not close after brief showers, but ask that you use your own judgment when coming to the park. ALWAYS

check our Hotline Line, it will be updated, as closings and openings require. We appreciate your cooperation with the Mud Closing Policy. This policy requires additional work and commitment to our Dog park by our volunteers. Because of this, we ask that some of you who live close to the park help out by taking on the duty of locking the gate – maybe on a rotating basis, monthly or quarterly. Contact Judi N (Willow) or Joan L (Rusty, Casey, Bisky) if you would like to help with the task of protecting our turf.

# **About those hay stacks**

The hay stacks are new – and are intended as climbing/play stations for the 4-Legges. We used hay stacks last year; the dogs enjoyed them. These are fresh ones; we will replace when they get too stinky from our boy dogs doing what boy dogs do. Hay is placed close to benches because our canines like to be near their humans. We realize the stacks will kill the grass on which they sit. That is ok. Moving the stacks only kills more turf.

#### **About water run-off**

With all of our water use – and all of the water discussions – some of you may not realize this - but all of our water run-off basically must drain into the soil – which is very hard packed – and it takes time for large amounts of water to drain. None of our water goes into any type of sewer system, other than short pvc pipes that takes the water away from the source – only a few feet – then it must eventually drain into the soil.
