

Turf Update as of April 17

After the 5+ inches of rain, which delayed our turf work during the first week of closure – we finally got a second SWCDP volunteer crew together on Sunday, April 6 – to finish raking straw and cleaning up the gardens. We were quite pleased with the turn out and finished our work almost 2 hours ahead of schedule. Then came more rain. This delayed the landscape contractor; he could not bring in his heavy equipment and crew for several days. On Saturday, April 12 – seven guys, three trucks, and an assortment of tools and attachments came to work. The straw was moist, but they hauled off in 3 truck loads. The 15 yards of dirt was still moist – but they did a pretty good job of distributing and grading. We still have a few dips but improvement was achieved. The crew worked for about 7 hours. Unfortunately, huge gusts of wind attacked the grounds just as they finished distributing the straw – by 7pm, most of the straw had been blown away or in clumps around the grounds or clinging to the fence. And, then, plenty more rain on Sunday. Bummer!

We evaluated the situation on Monday – and Wednesday. The contractor determined that most of the seed was not displaced by the wind and rain – and he brought in more straw to replace what we lost. We have the sprinkler system on a timer, so that the grounds will get watered any day that it does not rain to provide optimal growing conditions.

Now we must wait – and hope Mother Nature will give us a nice growing season so that we can re-open as planned. Tough start – but we are hopeful. We will need more volunteers in late May for final season prep.

Broemmelsiek Dog Park - Early event offers the opportunity for you to get in a fantastic 4-Legged activity - and still have most of your Saturday for other weekend activities. This is a **public** and **free dog park**; expect other 2 and 4 Leggeds to join us as the morning moves forward! Bring waste bags to pick up after your dog and water bowl for clean water for your dog to drink. There is a hose at the covered pavilion. Feel free to bring your lawn chair or beach towels, if you wish to sit on the grass or closer to the pond. Parking is close to gate entry and a restroom is on site.

Call Broemmelsiek **Hot Line 636/949-7475** before heading out – park closes to protect the turf when the grounds are wet. In case of a rain out – our event will move to the following Saturday – 4/26.

Directions to Broemmelsiek Dog Park

Schwede and Wilson Roads, off State Road DD. Take Highway 40/61, exit at the WingHaven Blvd (Highway DD) interchange – go south on Hwy DD for approximately 4 miles. Turn right on Schwede Road to the 2nd park entrance. Sign for "off leash" area at the 2nd entrance on the left. Follow signs to "off leash" area – Canine Drive. *About a 35 minute drive from our dog park*.
